FISCAL IMPACT: HB 462 does not amend the Illinois Pension Code, and therefore will have no fiscal impact.

\_\_\_\_\_

<u>SUBJECT MATTER</u>: HB 0462 creates the Personal Protection Act. The bill permits the county sheriff to issue permits to carry concealed firearms to persons at least 21 years of age who meet certain requirements. HB 0462 requires persons seeking a permit to complete specified training instituted by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board. HB 0462 would be effective immediately.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT:</u> HB 0462 does not amend the Illinois Pension Code, and therefore will have no fiscal impact.

<u>COMMENTS:</u> This bill would allow Illinois residents age 21 and over to carried a concealed firearm after the completion of certain training requirements. The bill does not amend the Illinois Pension Code. Therefore, there is no fiscal impact.
