FISCAL IMPACT: There is no discernable fiscal impact associated with HB 5366.

<u>SUBJECT MATTER</u>: HB 5366 amends the Chicago Police article of the Illinois Pension Code to remove the limitation on the rank of policemen who may serve on the Board of Trustees.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no discernable fiscal impact associated with HB 5366.

<u>COMMENT</u>: The Chicago Police Pension Fund Board of Trustees currently consists of 8 members, 4 of whom are appointed by the Mayor of Chicago. Of the four mayoral appointees, 3 must be policemen employed by the city, at least one of whom shall be a lieutenant or of a rank superior to lieutenant, and one of whom shall be the rank of sergeant, and one of whom shall be the rank of investigator or of a rank inferior to that rank. HB 5366 strikes all the foregoing ranking requirements with regard do the 3 active police members of the board. Should this bill become law, the 3 active policemen appointed by the mayor could serve on the board regardless of rank.

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
