SYSTEM(S): Chicago Fire

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no discernable fiscal impact associated with SB 3538 since the reversionary annuity would be equal to the actuarial reduction in value of the firefighter's retirement annuity. A similar reversionary annuity provision currently exists in the Chicago Police article of the Pension Code.

<u>SUBJECT MATTER</u>: SB 3538 amends the Chicago Fire article of the Pension Code to allow a fireman to elect to take a lesser amount of annuity to allow his or her surviving spouse to receive a reversionary annuity. This reversionary annuity would essentially be equal to the actuarial value of the amount by which the firefighter's pension is reduced.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: There is no discernable fiscal impact associated with SB 3538 since the reversionary annuity would be equal to the actuarial reduction in value of the firefighter's retirement annuity. A similar reversionary annuity provision currently exists in the Chicago Police article of the Pension Code.

<u>COMMENT</u>: A reversionary annuity reduces the retirement annuity that a member receives in order to provide an additional monthly annuity to a surviving, designated dependent beneficiary after the death of the member. SB 3538 adds a reversionary annuity provision to the Chicago Fire article of the Pension Code. Currently, the Chicago Police article of the Pension Code allows for the payment of a reversionary annuity in a manner substantially similar to SB 3538.
