FISCAL IMPACT: HB 3522, as amended, will have no fiscal impact on any pension funds or retirement systems in Illinois.

SUBJECT MATTER: HB 3522, as amended by HA #1, amends the Illinois Vehicle Code to provide that a third or subsequent (instead of a fourth) violation of provisions prohibiting driving while under the influence of alcohol, other drugs, intoxicating compound or compounds or any combination thereof that results in the death of another person is a Class X (instead of a Class 1) felony. HB 3522, as amended, provides that if the violation resulted in the deaths of 2 or more persons, the defendant will be sentenced to a term of imprisonment of not less than 10 years and not more than 45 years. HB 3522, as amended by HA #2, amends the Unified Code of Corrections to provide that a prisoner serving time for a third or subsequent violation that results in the death of another is eligible for no more than 4.5 days of good conduct credit for each month of his or her sentence (instead of being ineligible for any good conduct credit).

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: HB 3522, as amended, will have no fiscal impact on any pension funds or retirement systems in Illinois.

<u>COMMENT</u>: HB 3522, as amended, does not affect any retirement system or pension fund in Illinois.
