FISCAL IMPACT: SB 1933, as amended, will have no fiscal impact on any pension funds or retirement systems in Illinois.

SUBJECT MATTER: SB 1933, as amended by HA #1, amends the Department of Central Management Services Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois and the Workers' Compensation and Workers' Occupational Diseases Transfer and Transition Act to include other cases for compensation or treatment for accidental injury or death arising out of and in the course of employment or for compensation or treatment for a disease or death arising out of and in the course of the employment or which has become aggravated and rendered disabling as a result of the exposure of the employment in the cases where all amounts recovered through subrogation must be deposited into the Workers' Compensation Revolving Fund. SB 1933, as amended, includes in the definition of "workers' compensation functions" functions related to claims for compensation or treatment for accidental injury or death arising out of and in the course of employment and compensation or treatment for a disease or death arising out of and in the course of the employment or which has become aggravated and rendered disabling as a result of the exposure of the employment. In addition, SB 1933, as amended, includes in the definition of "workers' compensation services" services, claims expenses, and related administrative costs incurred in performing duties with respect to actions for compensation or treatment for accidental injury or death arising out of and in the course of employment or for compensation or treatment for a disease or death arising out of and in the course of the employment or which has become aggravated and rendered disabling as a result of the exposure of the employment. SB 1933, as amended, makes other changes concerning workers' compensation in regards to workplace injuries and occupational diseases, in addition to changes concerning the court of claims jurisdiction and deliberation periods for workers' compensation cases.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: SB 1933, as amended, will have no fiscal impact on any pension funds or retirement systems in Illinois.

<u>COMMENT</u>: SB 1933, as amended, does not affect any retirement system or pension fund in Illinois.
