FISCAL IMPACT: The fiscal impact of HB 1331, as amended by HA #1, cannot be determined as the number of teachers who will designate a domestic partner is unknown, however the costs are expected to be relatively minor.

<u>SUBJECT MATTER</u>: HB 1331, as amended by HA #1, amends the Chicago and Downstate Teacher Article of Illinois Pension Code by allowing designated domestic partners to qualify as surviving spouses for purposes of receiving survivor and death benefits.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: The fiscal impact of HB 1331, as amended by HA #1, cannot be determined as the number of teachers who will designate a domestic partner is unknown, however the costs are expected to be relatively minor.

<u>COMMENT</u>: HB 1331, as amended by HA #1, amends the Downstate and Chicago Teacher Articles of the Pension Code by adding specific langue delineating a domestic partner as someone who may receive survivor and death benefits, in the same manner as a surviving spouse. The bill also states that a domestic partner is an individual of the same gender as an unmarried teacher who (1) in involved with the teacher in a long-term relationship of indefinite duration; (2) has resided together with the teacher at the same address for at least 12 months; (3) is not related to the teacher by blood to a degree of closeness that would prohibit legal marriage in the state in which they legally reside; (4) is not married to any other person; and (5) has an exclusive mutual commitment to the teacher in which they agree to be jointly responsible for each other's common welfare and to share financial obligations.
