FISCAL IMPACT: SB 1007, as engrossed, will not impact any public pension fund or retirement system in Illinois.

SUBJECT MATTER: SB 1007, as engrossed, amends the Criminal Code of 1961. This bill provides that beginning 90 days after the effective date of this amendatory Act, it is unlawful for any person to knowingly manufacture, deliver, sell, purchase, or possess or cause to be manufactured, delivered, sold, purchased, or possessed a large capacity ammunition feeding device. This bill also provides that these provisions do not apply to a person who possessed a prohibited weapon, device, or attachment prior to this Act and such person may transfer such device only to an heir, an individual residing in another state maintaining that device in another state, or a dealer licensed as a federal firearms dealer.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: SB 1007, as engrossed, will not impact any public pension fund or retirement system in Illinois.

COMMENT: SB 1007, as engrossed, does not amend the Pension Code.
