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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The following document is a collection of data, tables, and graphs highlighting the results of the 2010 Census. This data, which was collected by the Census Bureau during 2010, was first released in terms of National and state population totals in December 2010. After this initial release, the Bureau has periodically released additional data with further detail.

Redistricting data, which included additional state, county and local counts, were released in February 2011. In May 2011, demographic profiles were released, which identified population and housing characteristics from a state-by-state and county-by-county perspective. In June 2011, specific population data specific to race were released and broken down by geographic location. Although additional 2010 census data will continue to be released by the U.S. Census Bureau over the next few years, the Commission has taken the data currently available and compiled it into an Illinois specific demographic report.

One of the most important aspects of the U.S. census is that the new population figures determine the number of seats a state occupies in the U.S. House of Representatives. While Illinois' population grew 3.3% between 2000 and 2010, this increase was below the national average growth of 9.7%. As a result of this shifting population base, Illinois' number of apportioned U.S. representatives was reduced from 19 to 18.

Although Illinois has experienced modest growth over the last decade, as with any state, certain areas saw significant population increases, while other areas saw notable falloffs. For example, Kendall County, near the southwest suburbs of Chicago, increased 110.4% over the last ten years. However, the City of Chicago saw their population fall 6.9%, which was a decrease of over 200,000 residents.

The following informational report provides numerous tables and charts that assist in identifying where the population shift is occurring. The report is broken down into four sections. The first section looks at the census data from a national perspective, which shows how Illinois' population changes compare to the nation and to other states across the country. The second section provides a Statewide perspective of Illinois' 2010 demographic data, including a detailed profile of Illinois' general population and housing characteristics. Also included in this section are Statewide income and benefits data as provided by the U.S. Census Bureau and the 2010 American Community Survey.

The third section looks at the Illinois data from a county-by-county perspective. This section helps identify the areas of the State that are seeing the largest change in the demographic data over the last decade. The final section displays the 2010 Census population by municipality, allowing the reader to see how the population of their hometown has changed over the last ten years.

At the opening of each section are dot-points highlighting notable observations from the provided tables and charts. All of the core data come from [www.census.gov](http://www.census.gov). Tables and charts were compiled by the Commission, obtained directly from the Census Bureau's website, or modified from other reputable sources.

## **I. A National Perspective**

### **Highlights:**

- Over the past decade, the United States' resident population grew 9.7%, reaching 308.7 million people in 2010. As Chart 1 on the following page displays, the largest increases came from the South (14.3%) and the West (13.8%) regions. The Midwest (3.9%) and the Northeast regions (3.2%) saw more modest increases.
- Illinois' population grew 3.3% over the last decade to reach a 2010 total of 12.8 million. Illinois remained as the 5<sup>th</sup> largest state in terms of population. However, it was the 43<sup>rd</sup> ranked state in terms of population growth between 2000 and 2010.
- The largest state in terms of population continues to be California at 37.2 million people. Rounding out the top five were Texas (25.1 million), New York (19.4 million), Florida (18.8 million), and Illinois (12.8 million). The lowest populated state continues to be Wyoming with 0.6 million people.
- A shifting population base has caused a reapportionment of the U.S. House of Representatives. Due to Illinois' lack of growth in comparison to other states, Illinois' number of apportioned representatives has fallen from 19 to 18.
- Other states losing representatives are Iowa (-1), Louisiana (-1), Massachusetts (-1), Michigan (-1), Missouri (-1), New Jersey (-1), New York (-2), Ohio (-2), and Pennsylvania (-1). States gaining representatives include Arizona (+1), Florida (+2), Georgia (+1), Nevada (+1), South Carolina (+1), Texas (+4), Utah (+1), and Washington (+1).
- In terms of population density, in 2010, Illinois had a density value of 231.1 people per square mile. This ranked Illinois 14<sup>th</sup> in the nation, a spot lower than its 2000 ranking of 13<sup>th</sup> with a density value of 223.7 people per square mile.
- The most densely populated state in 2010 (aside from the District of Columbia) was New Jersey at a value of 1,195 people per square mile. Rounding out the top five were Rhode Island (1,018), Massachusetts (839), Connecticut (738), and Maryland (595). The least dense state was Alaska at 1.2 people per square mile.
- The top five U.S. incorporated places in 2010, in terms of population, were New York City (8.2 million), Los Angeles (3.8 million), Chicago (2.7 million), Houston (2.1 million), and Philadelphia (1.5 million).

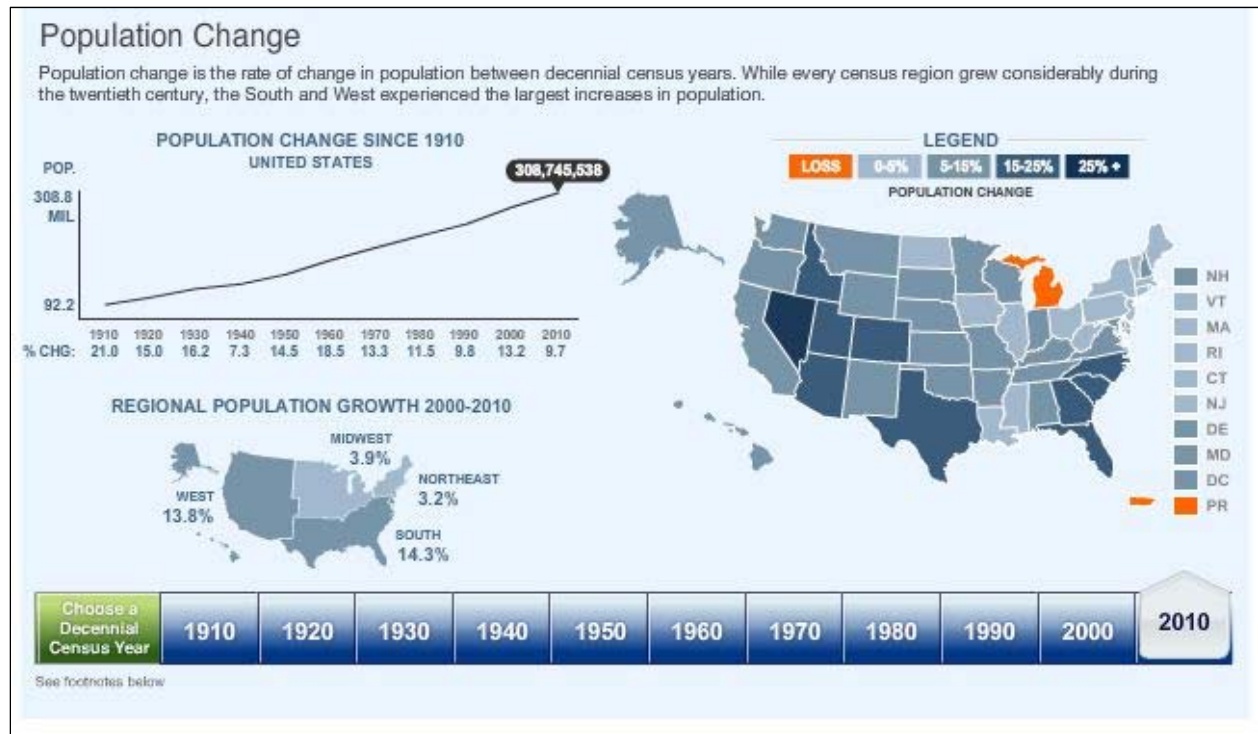
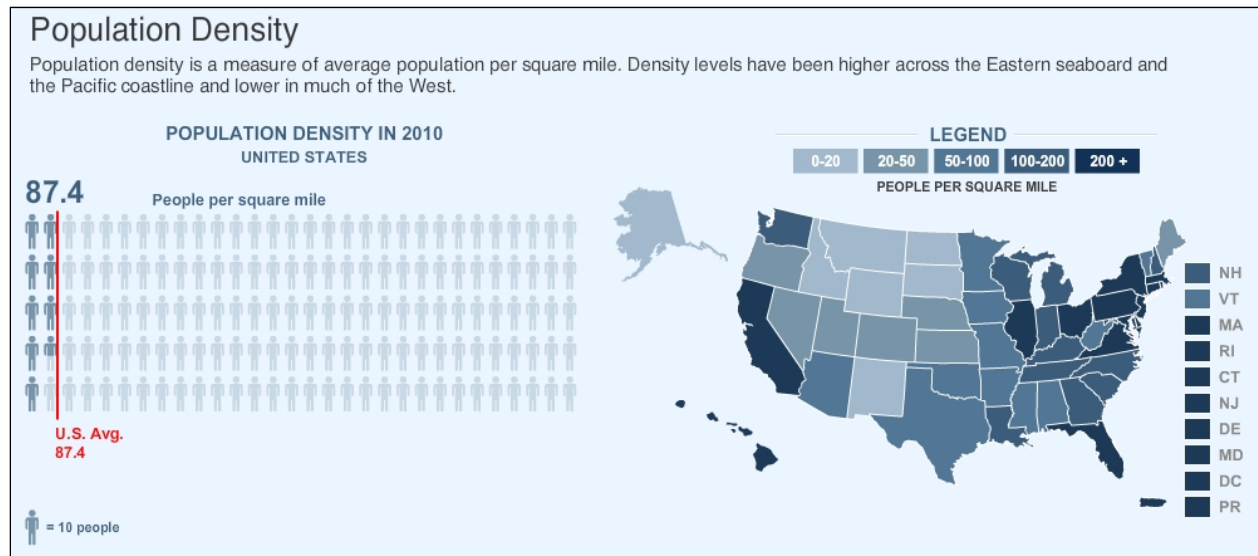

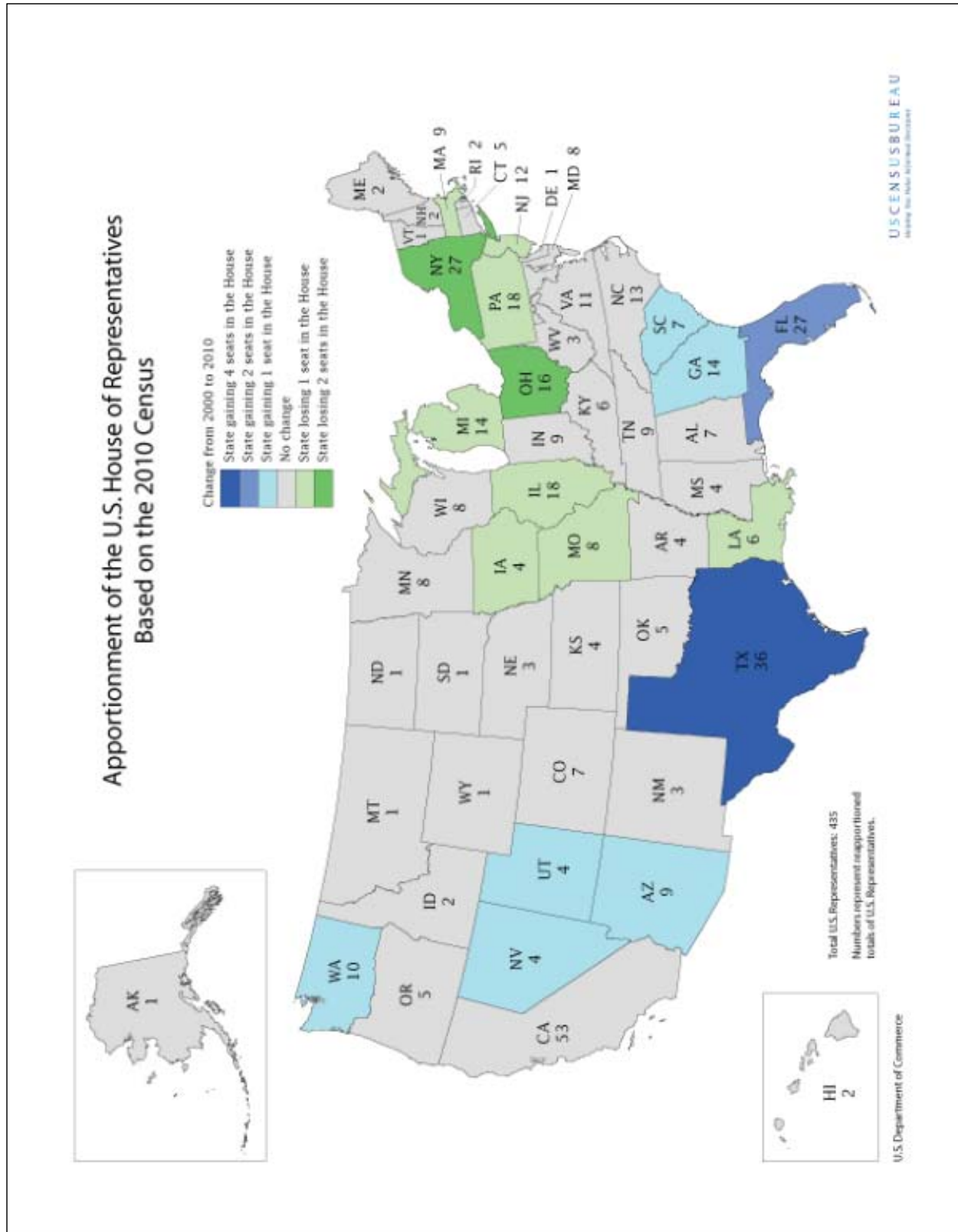

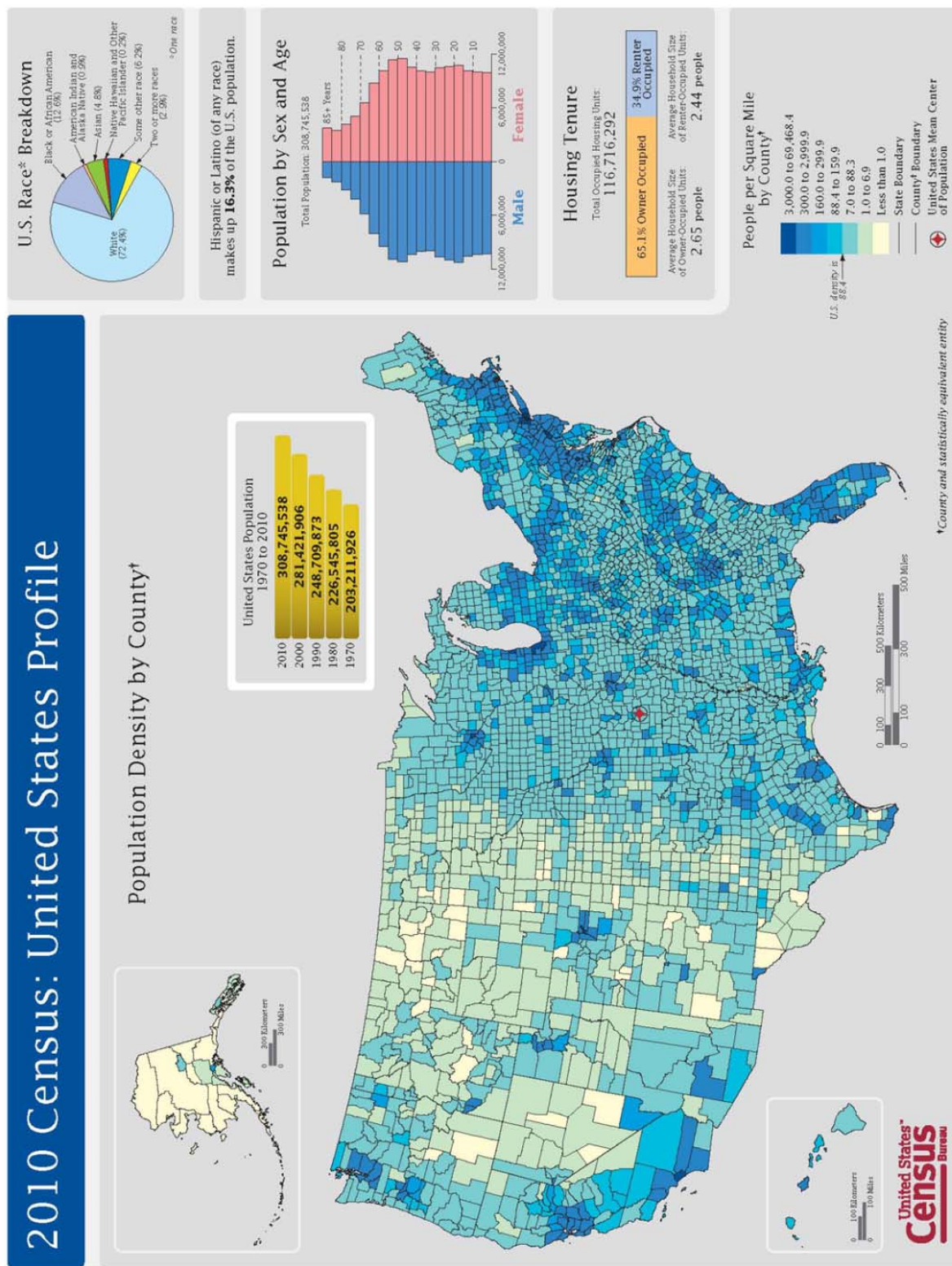
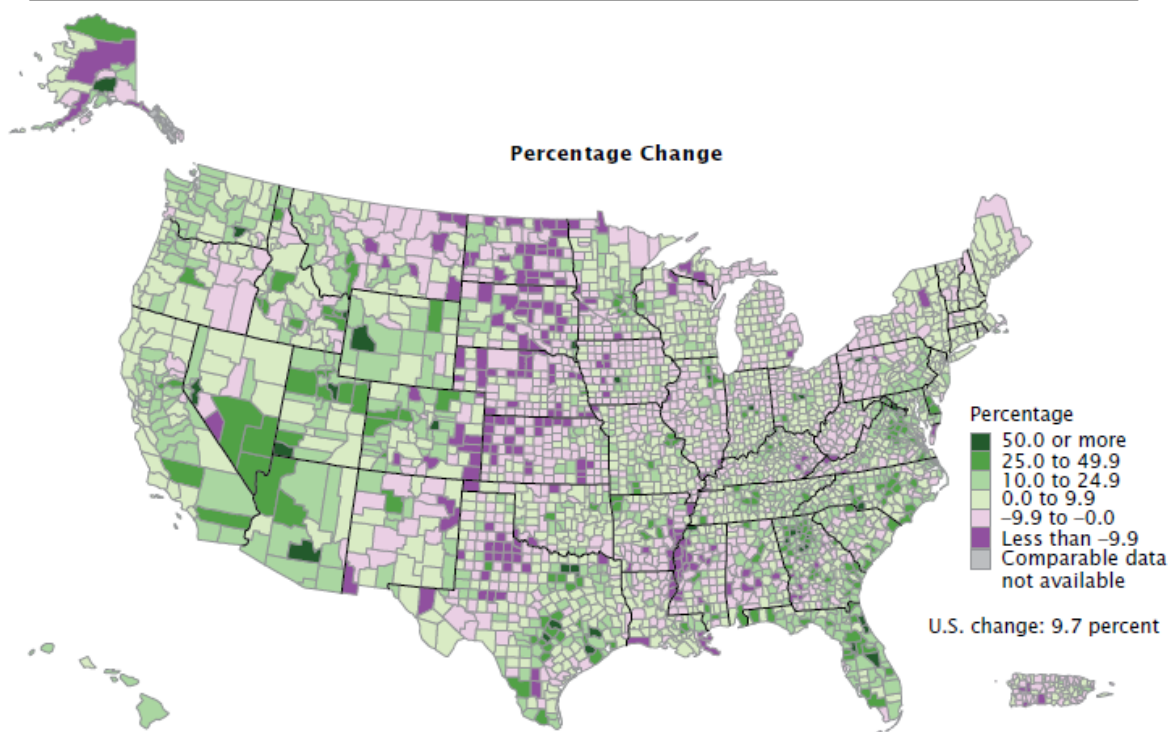
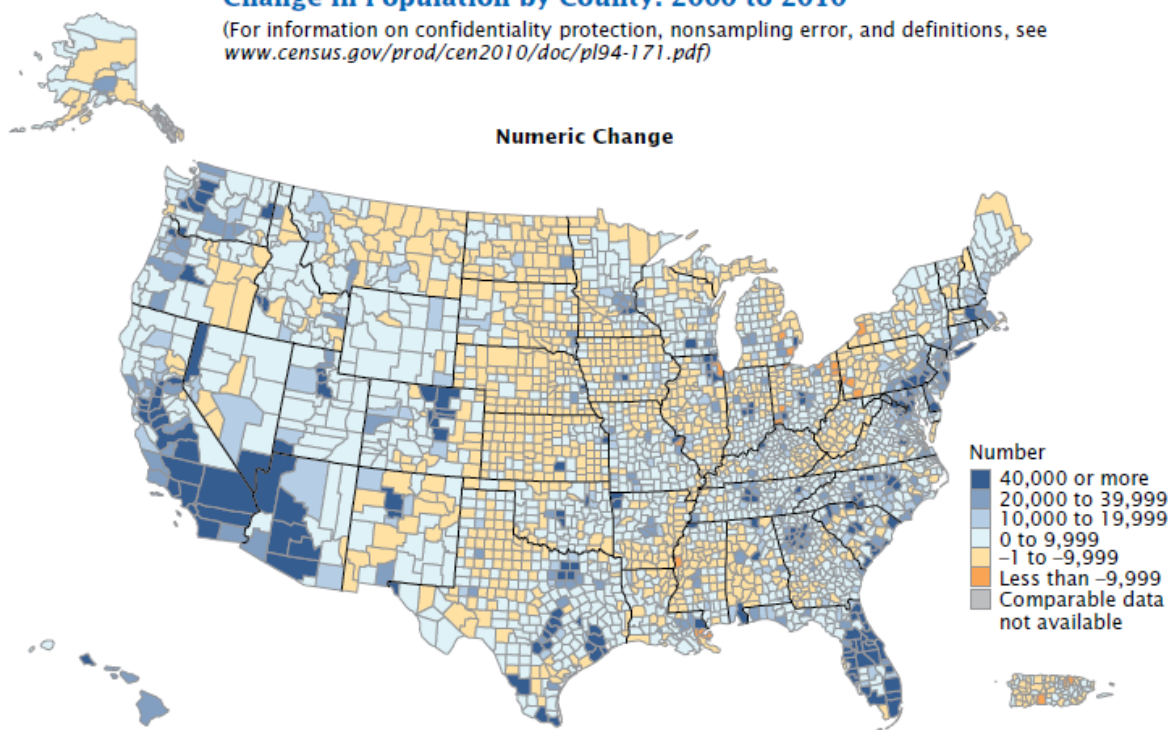

## II. A Statewide Perspective

### Highlights:

- Of the 12.4 million Illinois residents, 49% are male and 51% are female. Those 65 years and over make up 12.5% of the State's population. The median age in Illinois is 36.6, compared the U.S. median age of 37.2.
- In terms of race, whites continue to make the majority of Illinois' population at 71.5%. Blacks/African Americans make up 14.5% of the State's population, followed by Asians at 4.6%. Over 2.0 million Illinois residents or 15.8% of the population claim to be Hispanic or Latino.
- Of the 4.8 million households in Illinois, 65.8% were family households. The average family size in Illinois was 3.20 people. Of the family households, 30.1% had children under 18 years. Female householders, with no husband present, made up 12.9% of family households.
- According to the U.S. Census Bureau's 2010 American Community Survey, the Median family income in Illinois was \$65,417, which was above the U.S. figure of \$60,609. Illinois' per capita income level was \$27,325, compared to the National figure of \$26,059.
- The latest survey shows that 13.8% of Illinois residents had income in the past 12 months below the poverty level. Of those under 18 years, 19.4% fell below the poverty level at one time in the past 12 months.

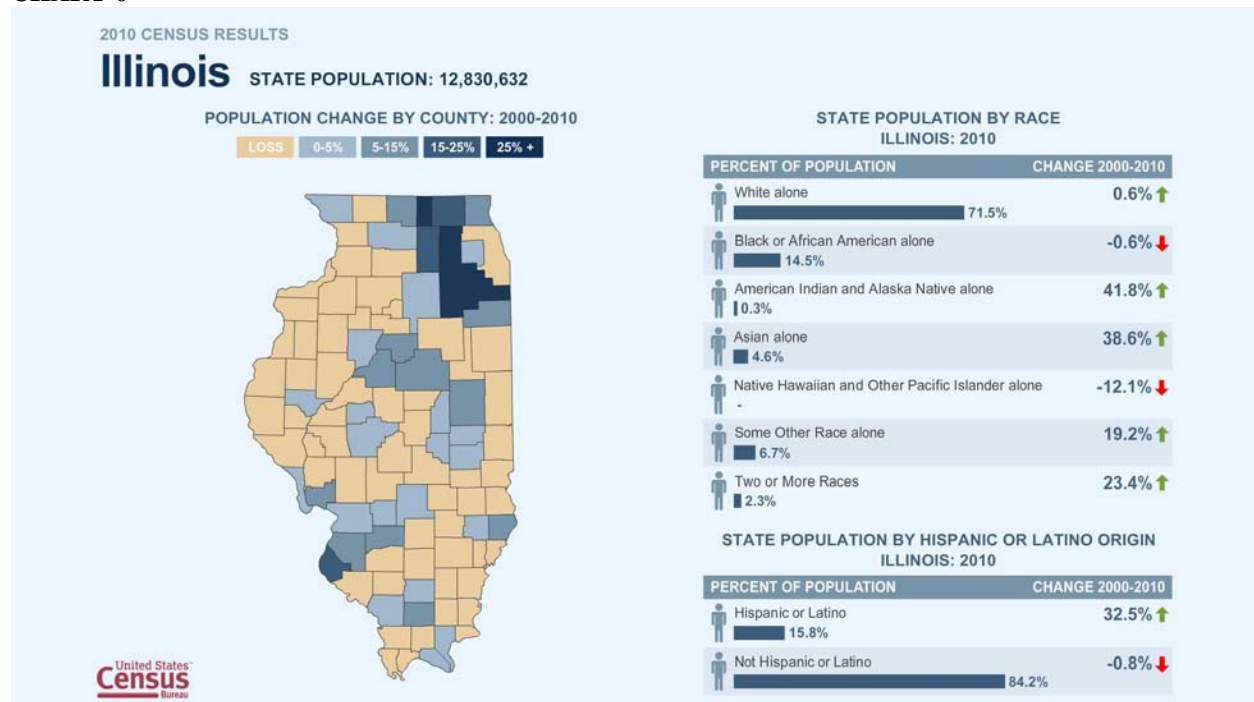

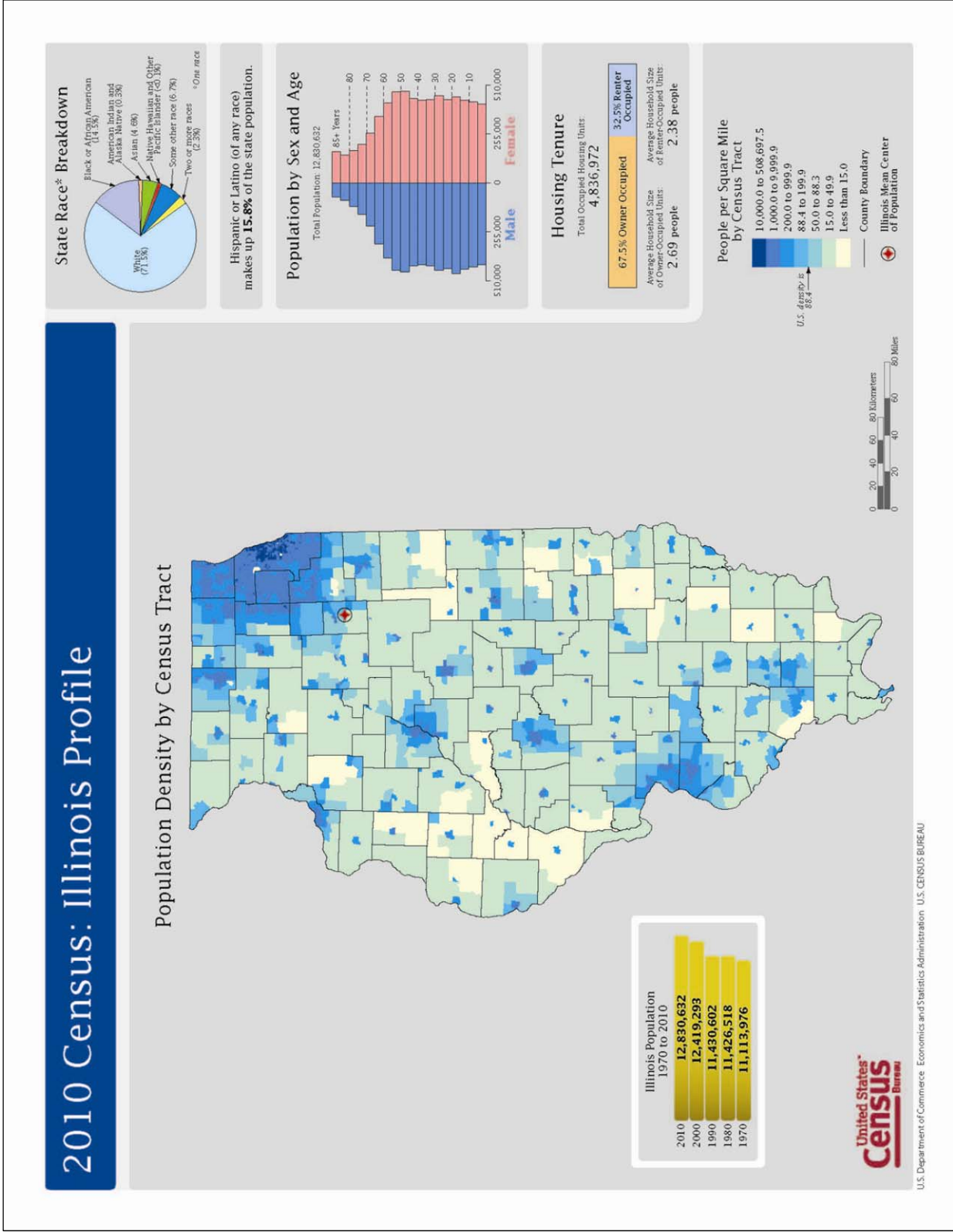

Demographic change since 2000, which includes births and deaths in a geographic area and migration in and out of a geographic area, will have an impact on the resulting 2010 Census counts. Demographic change since 2000, which includes births and deaths in a geographic area and migration in and out of a geographic area, will have an impact on the resulting 2010 Census counts. Additionally, some changes in the Hispanic origin and race questions' wording and format since Census 2000 could have influenced reporting patterns in the 2010 Census. For example, a respondent who indicated "White and Black or African American" was counted in the White alone or in combination category as well as in the Black or African American alone or in combination category. Consequently, the sum of all alone or in combination categories equals the number of races reported (i.e., responses), which exceeds the total population.

### **III. A County-by-County Perspective**

#### **Highlights:**

- Cook County continues to be, by far, the largest county in terms of population with nearly 5.2 million people. In second was DuPage County with 0.9 million people. The counties of Lake, Will, and Kane rounded out the top five.
- Kendall County had the largest increase (percent change) of any Illinois county between 2000 and 2010, increasing 110.4%. Other counties experiencing +20% growths were Will, Grundy, Boone and Kane. Will County grew by the most people increasing their population by over 175,000 in the last decade.
- The smallest of the 102 counties, in terms of population, was Hardin County with a 2010 census count of 4,320 residents. The county with the largest falloff (percent change) over the decade was Pulaski County, which fell 16% to a 2010 population of 6,161 residents. Despite its top population ranking, Cook County lost the most people over the last decade falling 3.4% or 182,066 people.
- On average, those under 18 years old make up 24.4% of the State's population. The county with the highest component of <18 year-olds was Kendall County at 31.4% of the county's population. The county with the lowest component of <18 year-olds was Brown County at 16.1% of their county's population.
- On average, those 65 years and older make up 12.5% of the State's population. The county with the highest component of 65+ year-olds was Pope County at 21.6% of the county's population. The county with the lowest component of 65+ year-olds was Kendall County at 7.3% of their county's population.
- In terms of a county's race composition, the county with the highest composition of whites was Calhoun County at 98.9%. The county with the highest composition of blacks/African Americans was Alexander County at 35.4%. The county with the highest composition of Asians was DuPage County at 10.1%. The county with the highest composition of Hispanics or Latinos was Kane County at 30.7%.
- Statewide, 48.3% of households lived in a house "owned with a mortgage or loan", 19.1% of households were "owned free and clear" and 32.5% of households were "renter occupied". The county with the highest composition of "renter occupied" households was Jackson County at 49.6%. The county with the highest composition of "owned free and clear" households was Hardin County at 48.0%. The county with the highest composition of households "owned with a mortgage or loan" was Kendall County at 74.5%.
- The county with the highest composition of residents with income below the poverty level was Jackson County at 29.6%. The county with the lowest composition was Kendall County at 3.5%.

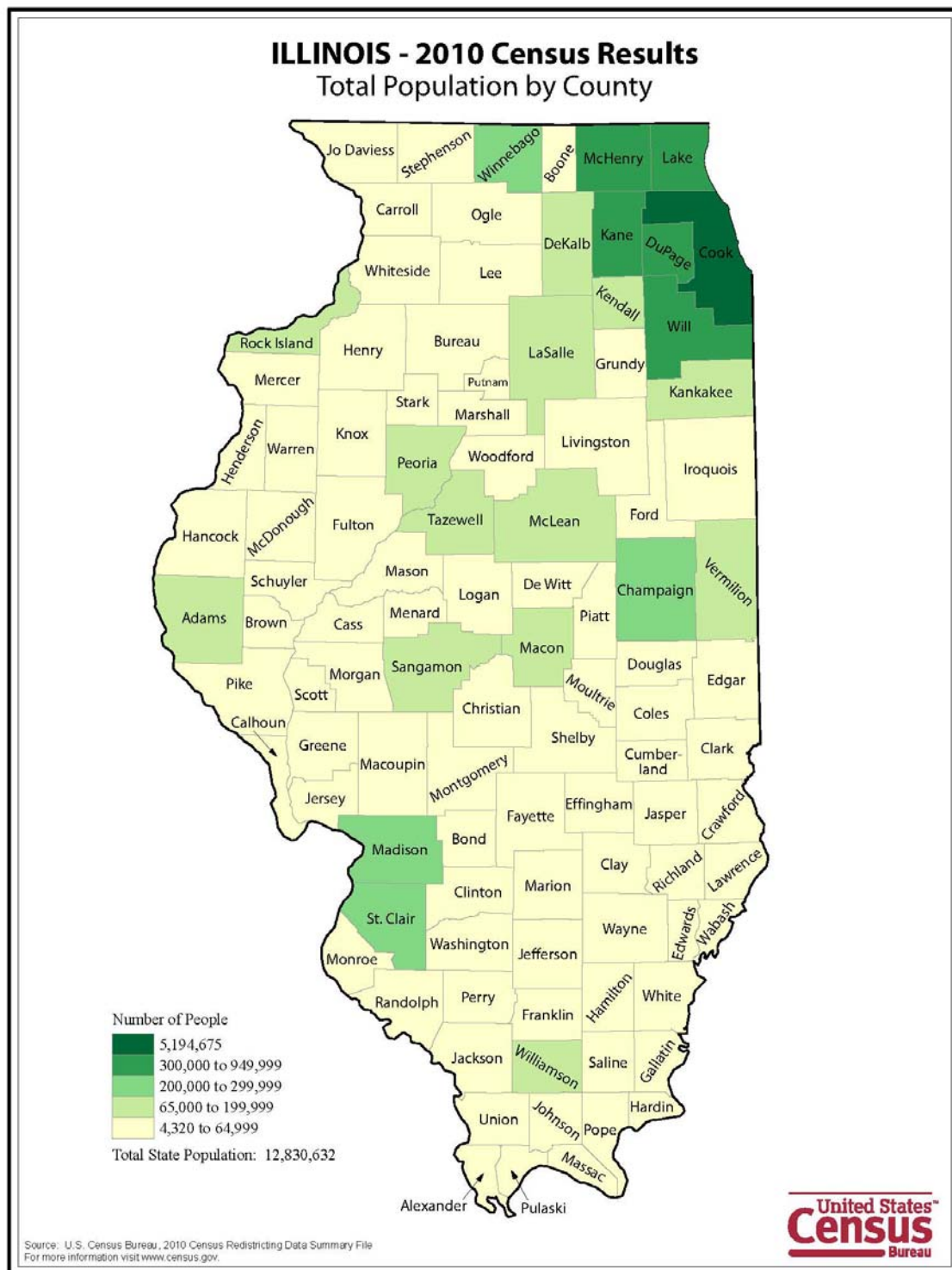
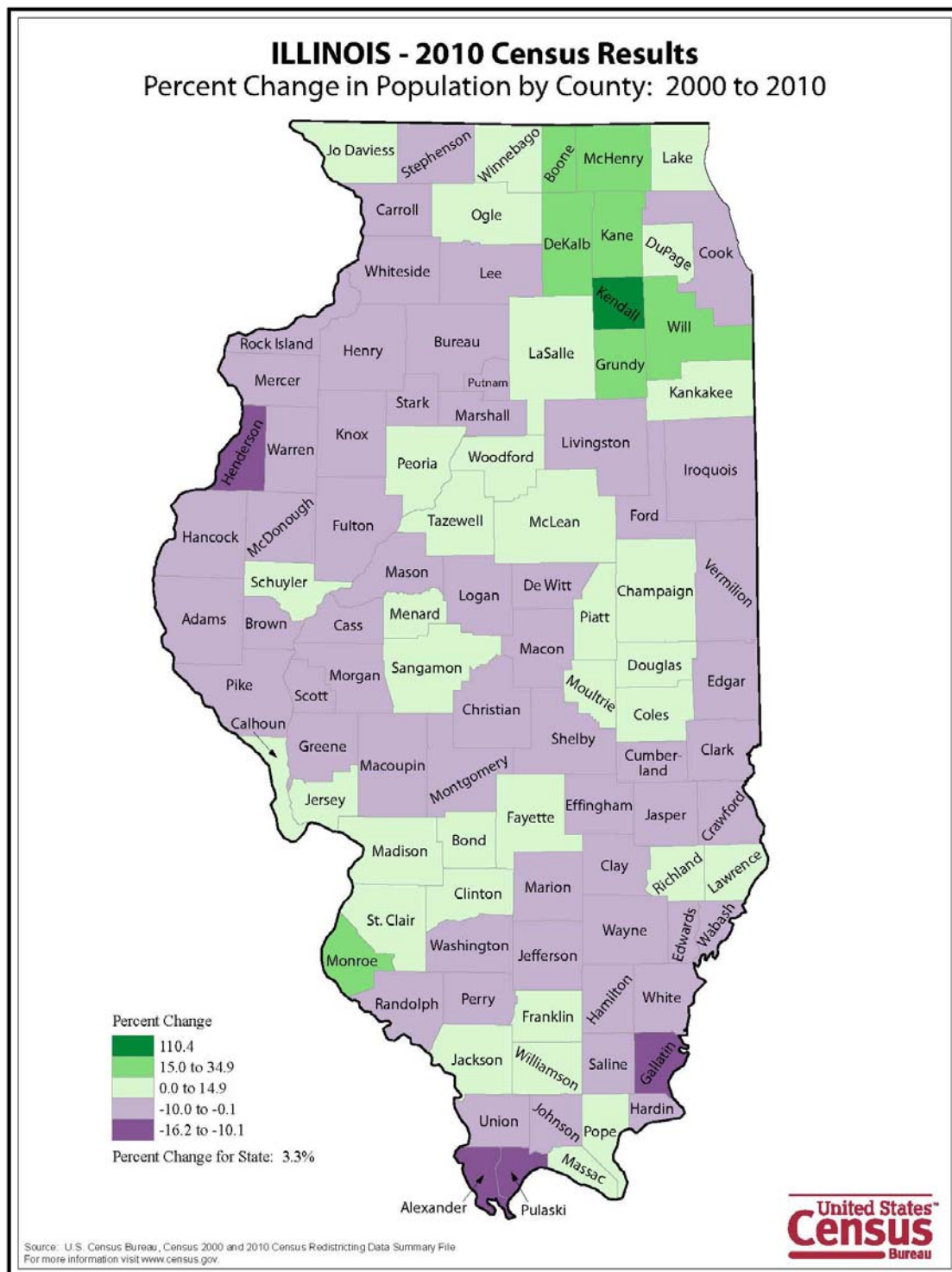

# BACKGROUND

The Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability (CGFA), a bipartisan, joint legislative commission, provides the General Assembly with information relevant to the Illinois economy, taxes and other sources of revenue and debt obligations of the State. The Commission's specific responsibilities include:

- 1) Preparation of annual revenue estimates with periodic updates;
- 2) Analysis of the fiscal impact of revenue bills;
- 3) Preparation of State debt impact notes on legislation which would appropriate bond funds or increase bond authorization;
- 4) Periodic assessment of capital facility plans;
- 5) Annual estimates of public pension funding requirements and preparation of pension impact notes;
- 6) Annual estimates of the liabilities of the State's group health insurance program and approval of contract renewals promulgated by the Department of Central Management Services;
- 7) Administration of the State Facility Closure Act.

The Commission also has a mandate to report to the General Assembly ". . . on economic trends in relation to long-range planning and budgeting; and to study and make such recommendations as it deems appropriate on local and regional economic and fiscal policies and on federal fiscal policy as it may affect Illinois. . . ." This results in several reports on various economic issues throughout the year.

The Commission publishes several reports each year. In addition to a "Monthly Briefing", the Commission publishes the "Revenue Estimate and Economic Outlook" which describes and projects economic conditions and their impact on State revenues. The "Legislative Capital Plan Analysis" examines the State's capital appropriations plan and debt position. "The Financial Conditions of the Illinois Public Retirement Systems" provides an overview of the funding condition of the State's retirement systems. Also published are an Annual Fiscal Year "Budget Summary"; "Report on the Liabilities of the State Employees' Group Insurance Program"; and "Report of the Cost and Savings of the State Employees' Early Retirement Incentive Program". The Commission also publishes each year special topic reports that have or could have an impact on the economic well-being of Illinois. All reports are available on the Commission's website.
